POSITION TYPE/EXPECTED HOURS OF WORK: This is a residential seasonal position. The usual camp work-week is six days on and one day off, including staff meetings, and regular duties. Our summer camp season is ten weeks long including pre-camp training. The summer camp position is exempt from minimum wage and overtime regulations per State of Massachusetts wage and hour law. Weekends are required.

SUMMARY: The Assistant Program Director works in the Recreational Department. They assist with designing and leading activities to help campers stay active, and have fun. They work alongside the Summer Program Director to plan, implement and manage multiple activity schedules and special events that occur during each week of camp. The activity schedule is the beating heart of camp and keeps each department accountable. Each week is planned chronologically and organized using an Excel Spreadsheet well in advance to give maximum planning time. The schedule is reviewed and signed off by each department leader before finally going to print, it is then distributed to each employee no later than the week before so that planning and preparation can commence.

The Assistant Program Director will complete pre-season professional advancement training and become certified in Archery Level 1 Instruction, and high and low ropes instruction so that they can competently teach rock climbing at our indoor climbing wall, and team building on our Low Ropes Challenge Course. They will also send campers soaring on our 40ft Giant Swing! They will provide supervision and assistance as necessary at various other activities including, Segways, mountain biking, Scavenger Hunts, and drive various water craft including our Pontoon boat and Kayaks. They will demonstrate and teach basic outdoor survival skills like fire starting and host themed parties, Spa night, Karaoke and more! Grotonwood offers fully subsidized training for individuals on the Program Team to become a certified Lifeguard.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Train, manage and motivate a team of Program Instructors and Activity Specialists in various life stages and with various levels of work and life experience
- Evaluate program quality and success, continuously to meet desired standards
- Review and report on equipment needs and supplies
- Ensure local laws and regulations are followed in accordance with Staff Policy Manual
- Assist with de-escalation of difficult conflict situations between campers and/or staff
- Follows Grotonwood's policies and procedures, including those related to medical and disciplinary situations, child abuse prevention, written documentation, and emergencies and hold staff accountable to the same
- Communicate camper/staff/retreat guest needs in a timely manner and hold staff accountable to the same
- Work closely with the Camp leadership to plan and implement special events such as 4th of July and Christmas in July
- Work with leadership team to generate all required resources and equipment.
- Process camper records ready for the clinical team to review
- Communicate with department leaders as needed
- Maintain recreation equipment in good order, repair or escalate for repair as necessary
- Attend trainings and meetings

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Dynamic, enthusiastic and creative personality with high levels of energy
- Ability to focus and command the attention of large groups of people using attention grabbers
- Ability to work independently, and as part of a team unsupervised
- Actively demonstrate commitment to Christ
- Fast learner: ability to understand instructions, rules and relay them concisely and effectively
- Ability to remain calm and in control in a pressured and fast paced environment
- Ability to deliver against established deadlines/metrics
- Physical ability and stamina to participate in all camp activities in hot/humid conditions
- Ability to manage interpersonal conflict and remain objective

- 2-3 years' experience in outdoor recreation, events management, teaching or youth ministry
- 2-3 years' experience in a management or supervisory role
- Ability to pass background checks and provide 3 positive references
- Good comprehension of American English intermediate level speaking and writing
- Excellent computer Literacy; comfortable using Microsoft Office and/or Apple office suites.
- Excellent customer service helpful and polite tone over the radio and email
- Excellent attention to detail for well executed plans and themes
- Punctual and schedule oriented ability to prioritize and manage multiple workloads effectively
- Ability to manage and supervise seasonal recreation staff who are in various life-stages
- Flexible and proactive self-starter with a positive attitude
- Assist campers and staff in emergency situations (fire, illness, or injury)
- Light janitorial duties maintain standards of safety and cleanliness in the Program Office
- Experience with graphic design, or marketing desirable but not essential
