
FACILITIES IMPROVEMENTS & SPECIAL PROJECTS

Going Cabin Remodel:

In January we wrote about the Going cabins being in urgent need of repair. We are pleased to announce that it's FINALLY getting the TLC it so desperately requires! Before you get too excited, we want to level your expectations and explain that this project is being made possible through donations so it will be rolled out in phases over the next 5 years as and when we reach a funding milestone. When complete, each cabin will host 16 campers and staff across 3 adjoining rooms each with its own bathroom! We have a feeling they'll be more popular than Judson Village with our youth camper!

So far, we've received enough support to begin the process of renovating one cabin! Will you help us raise the next \$100,000 needed for the next cabin?





Family Center Bathroom Renovations

The outdated Family Dining Hall Bathrooms from the 1970s finally received a much-needed remodel at the start of the year. The result was two stunning gender-neutral ADA accessible bathrooms. Chapel Roof and Cupola:



The Chapel roof has been a concern for the past few years, when it rains/snows water leaks in mainly through the Cupola, which is rotting and in serious need of repair. We explained this to Mr. Ed Guerard and he set to work rallying alumni and F.O.R.M donors to help us preserve the chapel by putting on a new roof. We reached our fundraising target of \$28,000 in October 2021 and contracted a Red Dog Roofing to complete the works. We cannot wait to show you the result in 2022. The Friends of Regional Ministries (F.O.R.M) provided funds to rent a chipper, purchase flowers, and provide other equipment and resources needed. Mike Socia, caretaker for the Garden, organized the day and the Grotonwood staff provided both expertise and leadership to help keep things running smoothly. Many of the volunteers were former full time and summer staff, current donors to the Friends of Regional Ministries, and members of many churches.

Brush and fallen trees were cleared and chipped, tons of leaves were raked and removed; a bell from the First Baptist Church of Littleton was prepared

to be in-stalled in the Garden; and groundwork was done for the installation of a second tribute wall. The day ended with a delicious meal prepared by the Chef Daniel and the Grotonwood kitchen staff.



Volunteers were rewarded with a real sense of accomplishment, a reminder of the value of teamwork, a whole lot of appreciation, and a discovery of aches and pains they hadn't experienced in years!

PROGRAMS & MINISTRY

Military Kids Camp 2021



This past summer we welcomed 120 children of military families to Grotonwood for another awesome summer of fun, social connection and faith exploration! Our new model allowed families to register for whatever week worked best with their schedule, and it was a resounding success, with many families coordinating their kid's session so that they could attend camp with their friends.

We're coming into 2022 bigger and stronger than

ever with 150 spots available for children of military families. With enrollment already open and taking registrations, we urge military families to book in sooner rather than later to avoid disappointment. Once all 150 spots are filled, the session will close and we will begin to waitlist, which does not guarantee a spot.



Epilepsy Foundation Purple Camp 2021



We have been hosting a week of summer camp for Epilepsy Foundation New England (EFNE) since 2018. Each year, 32 children with varying levels of seizure activity attend camp for a week of fun, positive risk taking and social connection. A lot of campers speak of feeling isolated or 'othered' and would not have the opportunity to attend a standard week of camp due to their medical condition. However, an increased ratio of care and heightened medical supervision makes it all possible. We look forward to many more years of Keto-Friendly S'mores around the campfire! Elevate Winter youth Retreat 2021: For grades 2-5 & 6-11

In February we hosted 30 youth for a 3-day midweek retreat during winter break. The theme was, 'Your Story' with our overarching scripture verse coming from Psalm 78:4. In seminars and chapel services the kids learned about Jesus' story and what it meant to tell their own story in a world that doesn't always welcome it. The kids worshipped their hearts out and went home changed and equipped with more of the Lord. The schedule included sledding, a snow sculpting competition and a hot chocolate and cookie bar. Evening activities featured lipsync battles, and a Pirate costume Mystery Dinner Party!



Day Camp in the Spring 2021: For grades K-8



This year we hosted our first ever Day Camp program during April Vacation. It was a big success with over 30 children attending the week. Our theme was the Amazing Race and every day the kids would work in teams to complete tasks and challenges that worked on critical thinking, team work,

creativity, hand eye coordination, patience and S.T.E.M. From creating 30inch high structures with toothpicks and gummies, to cracking riddles and racing around camp with a wooden spoon and a ping pong ball (which is wayyy harder than it sounds!) we had a blast. In chapel the kids learned how to run the race with God and what to do when we run in to life's road blocks. We



finished the week with Store-time, a game of human hungry Hippos and very happy hearts!

Spring Vacation was another new retreat launched this past March by our Adults with Disabilities Program Director Lina Delrio. The retreat

Fall Vacation is now in its 5^{th} year and proving a great success. We welcomed 6 new campers and 60% of our demographic was under the age of 28 a

Teen Discipleship Program: For grades 8-11

This October we launched our first Teen Discipleship Program (TDP) for grades 8-11. TDP is a fourmonth program for youth that are committed to taking their walk with God to the next level. The group is focused on growing their relationship with God within a small community of believers, just like Jesus did with his twelve disciples. Working through the bible study, "Something needs to Change", by David Platt they discuss what it means to follow Jesus in a world full of urgent physical and spiritual needs.

Our TDP community met in person for the first-time last week for study, and to share a meal together. it was heartwarming and encouraging to see their passion, energy and understanding. On the weeks that we do not meet there is a personal study assignment and some reading. What happens after TDP?

Teens age 14-15: Subject to progress and graduation from the program, teens age 14 – 15 will have the opportunity to enroll on to our new two-week Staff In Training (SIT) program in the summer of 2022. The SIT program is by invitation only and will introduce teens to mechanics of working at camp while still allowing them to be campers! SIT candidates will rotate through our various programs including Day Camp, Youth Overnight Camp, Adults with Disabilities Camp, Kitchen, Maintenance and our Activities & Events Team to give them a well-rounded experience.



Teens age 16+: Teens age 16+ will have to opportunity to be employed at Grotonwood for the summer. We only have a certain amount of staff positions allocated for youth age 16-17; Employment is competitive and subject to an interview and satisfactory progress on the Teen Discipleship Program.



To close: It is our earnest prayer and desire that our teen disciples will see, taste and know the things of God in a new, inspired and authentic way, choosing to grow and be molded by the scriptures and the power of the holy spirit. To really know the costly price of Grace in following Christ. That they have eyes to see and ears to hear the injustices of this world, that they would stand up and be heard and have open hearts to know the pure and redeeming love of God.

Easter at Grotonwood 2021:

Our staff had some real fun hosting Grotonwood's first ever Easter Eggstravaganza in April! We had 45 children enroll to the event. They enjoy an afternoon filled with eggcellent activities, which included an Easter Egg Hunt, easter inspired crafts, a campfire worship session and a Bible study! The sun shone, and the kids had such a hoot socializing, meeting the Easter Bunny, playing together and hunting for those treasured eggs!

This was just one of over 25 weekend events hosted at Grotonwood over the course of 2021 for kids age 5-17. A big



thank you to Julia, our Youth Program Director for planning and leading all these life-giving events with such gusto! They keep our little camp community connected and so happy. We hosted hikes, experiential adventure days, movie nights, baking sessions, Tea parties and more!
